

Vincent Van Gogh

Vincent Van Gogh was a post-impressionist painter and was the creator of one of the most recognized paintings of all time, "The Starry Night." This painting combined the sights of nighttime with items from his home, the Netherlands. The end result was a mix of reality and Van Gogh's memory and imagination.



The Starry Night can be seen in The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York.

Try your hand at creating a copy of The Starry Night. Below you will see a puzzle drawing of the painting. You will need to print the page. ***

With a pencil copy the lines from each of the squares of the top grid into the squares on the bottom grid that has the same letter/number.

The best way to do this is by beginning with the squares that are connected to squares that have some lines in place. Begin by copying squares – use a pencil.

C1, E1, F1

D2, E2, G2

C3, E3, F3

C4, D4, E4, G4

B5, D5, E5

Now copy the remainder of the squares.

Compare your drawing to the painting.

Use crayons or colored pencils to add color.
